2025 Nonresident Deer and Elk Tags go on sale December 10, 2024.

To use this supplement:

This supplement provides tag quotas and limits by location for general-season elk, regular deer, and white-tailed deer tag types. It is intended to be used as a cross reference with the **Idaho Big Game Seasons and Rules brochure**, which specifies hunt seasons and boundaries, as well as wildlife laws and other useful information. Visit idfg.idaho.gov/rules/big-game to view the brochure.

Nonresident tag limits published here were set using the previous year's (2024) seasons and rules. Tag numbers identified in this brochure *may* change for the 2025 season in response to the 2025 season setting process. The Fish and Game Commission retains emergency authority to modify or eliminate hunts within the season-setting cycle.

Big game seasons for 2025 will be set by the Idaho Fish and Game Commission in March 2025. **Please verify that your hunt has not been changed or eliminated when the Idaho Big Game 2025 Seasons and Rules brochure is published in April 2025.**

Definitions:

Cap: The total number of resident, nonresident, and outfitter elk tags available by capped elk zone.

Limit: The total number of nonresident tags available by unit for deer or uncapped zone for elk.

Quota: The total number of nonresident deer or elk tags available statewide.

Idaho Nonresident Deer and Elk Tags

Nonresident General Season Hunts (including capped elk zones)

Nonresident hunters in general-season deer and uncapped elk zone hunts are limited to 10 or 15 percent of the total hunters in each game management unit or elk zone. Some backcountry deer units (7, 9, 10, 12, 16A, 17, 19, 19A, 20, 20A, 26, and 27) have been limited to the five-year average number of nonresidents where overall hunter numbers have been relatively low. When purchasing a nonresident tag, the buyer must choose the unit or zone from those available.

The statewide nonresident general-season quota for elk is 12,815 and 15,500 for deer (14,000 regular deer or white-tailed deer tags and 1,500 white-tailed deer tags to be made available for sale when the initial 14,000 tags are sold out).

Nonresident Capped Elk Zones

Tags are limited for both residents and nonresidents in capped elk zones. When caps are implemented to restrict the number of tags within a zone, the total number of tags under the new cap is allotted proportionally among resident hunters, nonresident hunters, and outfitted hunters based on historical participation in the zone.

Subsequent changes to the overall cap are applied proportionately.

Tags Allocated to Outfitted Hunters

Deer and elk tags are allocated for outfitted hunters in general-season hunts, capped elk zones, and controlled hunts. A portion of the statewide general-season nonresident quotas for deer and elk are set aside for allocation to outfitted hunters for general-season hunts. For the 2025 season, 1,846 deer tags and 2,975 elk tags are set aside to be allocated. The 2,975 elk tags include capped elk zones.

Outfitter Tags - General-season Hunts (including capped elk zones)

General-season deer and elk tags are allocated for use by outfitted hunters based on historic outfitted use in each deer unit or uncapped elk zone. Allocation in

capped elk zones is based on the proportion of resident, nonresident, and outfitter participation at the time the cap was implemented.

Outfitter allocated tags unsold by July 31 will be made available to the public during a sale in early August. These tags can be purchased by nonresidents as a first and/or second tag, or purchased by residents as a second tag at the nonresident price for use in units or zones where the Fish and Game Commission has not restricted use of second tags. Tags remain subject to the overall nonresident quota and limits on individual units and zones for nonresidents.

Outfitter Tags - Controlled Hunts

Tags allocated to outfitted hunters in controlled deer and elk hunts are available only to persons that have entered into a signed agreement for the services of a licensed outfitter. Tag numbers are set at the level of the individual controlled hunt.

Unsold and/or returned controlled-hunt tags allocated to outfitters are not sold or otherwise made available for purchase by the general public.

Additional Information

The 2025 hunting seasons and rules will be approved in March 2025 and posted on IDFG's website in April of 2025 (idfg.idaho.gov/big-game).

It is the tag holder's responsibility to know the rules for the tag they have purchased, including season dates and restrictions. IDFG will contact tag holders only if the tag holder's hunt is entirely eliminated (all seasons eliminated) and inform them of available options.

Hunting in a Chronic Wasting Disease Management Zone

As of October 2024, IDFG has established Chronic Wasting Disease Management Zones in units 14, 18, and a portion of unit 1 (portion of Boundary County east of the Selkirk crest).

Transport Rules Apply to Deer, Elk, and Moose From a CWD Management Zone

It is unlawful to transport any deer, elk, or moose (including salvaged animals) out of units 14, 18, and a portion of unit 1 (portion of Boundary County east of the Selkirk crest). However, there are exceptions for meat and some other animal parts. Visit: idfg.idaho.gov/cwd/zone-rules.

CWD Testing Required for hunter-harvested Mule Deer and White-tailed Deer in Units 14, 18, 23, 24, 32A, and a portion of 1 (portion of Boundary County east of the Selkirk crest).

Heads or lymph nodes must be submitted within 10 days of harvest.

Should I get my deer, elk or moose tested for CWD if I harvest outside of the Required Test Units?

- **Yes, testing is recommended for**
 - Elk and moose harvested in Units 1, 14, 18, 23, 24, or 32A.
 - Deer, elk and moose harvested in any unit adjacent to Units 1, 14, 18, 23, 24, or 32A.
 - Deer, elk, and moose harvested in any unit that borders Washington, Montana, Wyoming, or Utah.
- **Hunters who harvest in any other units** and are concerned if their deer, elk, or moose may be infected with CWD.

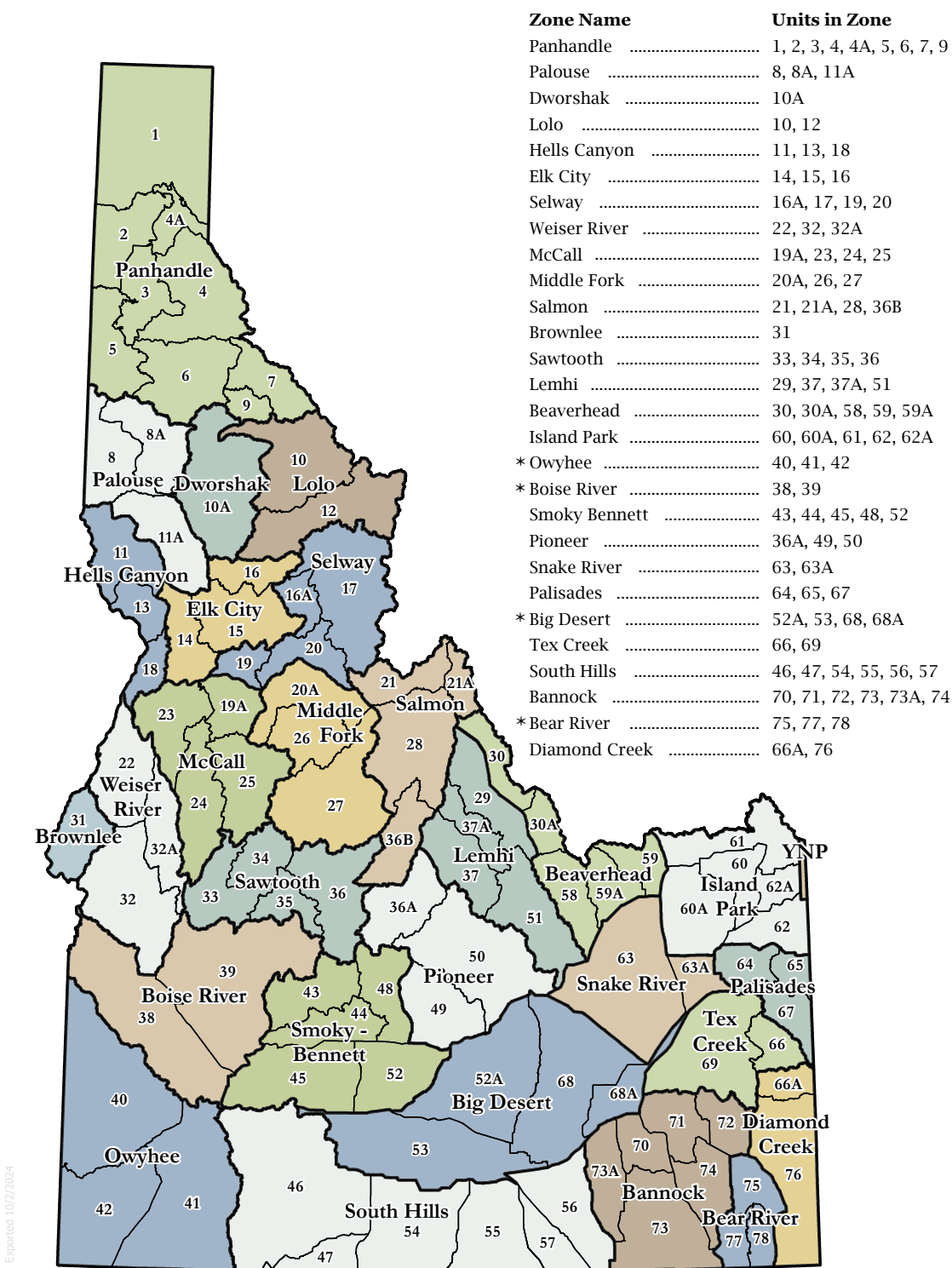

Nonresident Licenses and Tags

Question: I am a nonresident wanting to purchase a tag during the Nonresident tag sale on December 10th. How should I purchase my tag? What information should I know about how this sale operates?

Answer: Nonresident tags are available for purchase beginning at 10 am Mountain time on December 10. Hunters logging in online will be entered into the virtual waiting room and will be assigned a place in line once the sale begins. There is no advantage to logging in at any particular time prior to the sale, but be mindful that any customer entering the site after 10 am will be placed at the end of the line. Note that each hunter will need to log into their own customer account to purchase a tag, and that the ability to purchase tags for multiple customers under one account is not currently available. Tags may also be purchased in-person at our license vendor locations (license.gooutdoorsidaho.com/Licensing/LocateAgent.aspx), at IDFG regional offices idfg.idaho.gov/offices, or over the phone at 1-800-554-8685.

Question: I am a nonresident lifetime license holder wanting to purchase tags. What information should I know?

Answer: Nonresident lifetime license holders are not within the nonresident limits or quotas, and therefore, do not need to participate in nonresident tag sales, including the Dec. 10 sale. Nonresident lifetime license holders can purchase tags in the summer when resident tags become available for sale.

Question: How will I know if there are tags available to nonresidents?

Answer: Customers can view real-time availability by signing in to the online purchase site GoOutdoorsIdaho.com and selecting a deer or elk tag for purchase. The number of available tags by unit (deer) and zone (elk) will be displayed. Sold out units and zones will indicate “sold out.” There are also *statewide* nonresident tag quotas for elk and deer. When the *statewide* quota is reached, tags will show as “sold out”.

IDFG will post updates on tag availability on IDFG’s website at idfg.idaho.gov/tag/quotas-nonresident.

Question: Can the nonresident limits for deer tags by unit and elk tags by zone increase or decrease?

Answer: Yes. Any change to limits requires a decision from the Idaho Fish and Game Commission. The limits will be evaluated during the big game season setting cycle.

Question: What happens if my season is changed or eliminated if the Idaho Fish and Game Commission changes season and tag limits in March 2025?

Answer: It is your responsibility to know the rules for the tag you have purchased, including season dates and restrictions. IDFG will contact you *only* if your hunt is entirely eliminated (*all* seasons eliminated) and inform you of available options.

Question: What tag options do I have if I am a nonresident Disabled American Veteran (DAV)?

Answer: Nonresident DAV priced tags are limited to 500 deer tags, and 300 elk tags. DAV deer tags are valid statewide, and DAV elk tags are only valid in the selected zone. Once those 800 tags have been sold, DAV license holders can purchase available general nonresident tags at the nonresident price.

Question: What requirements are there for Junior Mentored hunting tags?

Answer: Junior Mentored tag holders, age 10 to 17, must be accompanied by a licensed adult aged 18 or older. The licensed adult must have a valid current year tag for the same species as the Junior Mentored tag holder. Hunters are not eligible for a refund for the Junior Mentored license in the event that the licensed adult is unable to purchase a same species tag. A refund of a portion of the tag fee may be available, depending on the date the refund is requested. See the current Big Game Seasons and Rules for additional details on youth hunt information. Note that nonresident junior mentored hunters only need to participate in the nonresident tag sale if they are purchasing capped elk zone tags. Uncapped elk zones and statewide deer tags can be purchased at any time.

Question: Will there be a difference between archery, any weapon, and muzzleloader tags?

Answer: Some deer and elk tags have archery, muzzleloader, and/or general weapon seasons that should

be reviewed within the current Big Game Seasons and Rules brochure prior to purchase. Some tags may require a hunter to purchase an additional archery or muzzleloader permit, which allows the hunter to hunt in seasons limited by weapon type. Hunters purchasing an archery permit must provide an archery safety education (bowhunter) certification number.

Question: Are controlled hunt tags for nonresidents part of the nonresident limits by deer unit and elk zones?

Answer: No. Tags for nonresidents who successfully draw a controlled hunt are not counted as part of the nonresident quota, and they are not part of the limits placed on deer units and uncapped elk zones for nonresidents. However, nonresidents are limited to no more than 10% of the overall tags in controlled hunts.

Outfitted Hunt Questions

Question: How do I obtain the services of an outfitter?

Answer: You should contact the outfitter directly to inquire about hunts. The Idaho Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board provides an online search function of outfitters by species hunted and hunt area at <https://dopl.idaho.gov/oglb>.

Question: Does the outfitter provide the deer or elk tag? Can I hire an outfitter even if I already have a tag?

Answer: The outfitter may be able to provide hunters with outfitter-allocated deer and elk tags depending on what each individual outfitter has available. Outfitters may also offer services to hunters who have bought their own tags; contact outfitters for your tag area to discuss specific arrangements.

Nonresident Tags Sold Out, Refunds & Exchange Questions

Question: Do I have to purchase my license before I try to buy a limited tag, or can I purchase both at the same time?

Answer: Customers may purchase a license and tag at the same time. License fees cannot be refunded, per Idaho rule, even if you are unable to purchase your desired tag. IDFG encourages you not to pre-purchase a license, and instead purchase the license during your tag transaction.

Question: I haven't purchased my license or tag yet. Do I need to add my license to my shopping cart before I add my tag?

Answer: Yes, you will need to add your license prior to adding a tag to your cart. If you select a tag first, the system will prompt you to choose a license, then you can proceed to the tag selection portion of your purchase.

Question: I have never purchased a license in Idaho before, but want to compete for a limited tag. What information will I need to provide?

Answer: It is recommended that you create an account at GoOutdoorsidaho.com before the nonresident tags go on sale. Required information includes your name, address, gender, eye color, hair color, height, weight, email address, last 4 digits of your social security number (other documentation is also accepted such as Travel Visa, non-US driver license, passport, tax ID & green card), hunter education number with issuing state, and phone number.

Question: Will I get a refund on my license and tag if the rest of my hunting party cannot get a tag for the same area?

Answer: No refund on the license is available. A refund of a portion of the tag fee may be available, depending on the date the refund is requested. Details on refund requests can be found at idfg.idaho.gov/licenses/forms/nonresident-refund.

Question: Will I get a refund on my license and tag if I got the wrong zone/unit and cannot exchange the tag for the area I want?

Answer: No refund on the license is available. A refund of a portion of the tag fee may be available, depending on the date the refund is requested. Details on refund requests can be found at: idfg.idaho.gov/licenses/forms/nonresident-refund.

Question: How do I request a refund on my tag?

Answer: Refund requests must be mailed in with the tag and a refund request form. See idfg.idaho.gov/licenses/forms/nonresident-refund for details on requesting a refund.

Question: What are my options if I do not get the tag for the area I want?

Answer: A hunter can apply for a controlled hunt, Super Hunt, or try to exchange to a tag for the desired area if one is returned to IDFG through a returned tag sale. Hunters must have a valid hunting license to apply for controlled hunts. No license is required to purchase a Super Hunt application. More information on returned tag sales can be found at idfg.idaho.gov/tag/returns.

Question: Can I exchange my tag from one zone/unit to another?

Answer: Yes, exchanges are available for a fee, subject to tag availability in the other unit/zone, and only before

the beginning of any portion of the hunting season of the tag held. Please note that if an exchange is an option, the hunter will need to return the original tag and submit the exchange fee to IDFG before receiving the new tag. Tags may be exchanged at IDFG offices and by mail.

Question: Can I exchange my tag online?

Answer: Tags may only be exchanged online during Returned Tag Sales (pending availability), and only before the beginning of any portion of the hunting season of the tag held. Successful exchanges made online will require the tag holder to return the original tag to IDFG before receiving the new tag. More information on Returned Tag Sales, including sale dates, can be found at idfg.idaho.gov/tag/returns.

Question: What is the period for me to do an exchange?

Answer: Tag exchanges for units/zones that are not sold out are allowed before the beginning of any portion of the hunting season of the tag held. Exchanges can be done via mail and in-person at IDFG regional offices. Online exchanges can be completed during returned tag sales.

Question: I bought a regular deer tag but meant to get a white-tailed deer tag. How does that work?

Answer: A Regular Deer tag can be used to harvest white-tailed deer in some circumstances. Check the current Big Game Seasons and Rules brochure to confirm the general seasons and areas for regular and white-tailed deer. If you need additional assistance contact IDFG at licenses@idfg.idaho.gov.

Shed Antler Gathering

It is a popular late-winter and spring activity that lets people enjoy time outdoors and bring home deer and elk antlers. Please remember deer and elk are still trying to survive the rigors of winter, and protecting them should always take priority over finding antlers. To protect our valuable wildlife, please do your antler hunting responsibly.

- **Do not chase or harass deer, elk or other wildlife**, and don't allow your dogs to chase or disturb wildlife. Even if the weather is warm and sunny, animals are still stressed from winter, especially the young ones.
- **Wait until deer and elk have left winter range before hiking and searching for antlers.**
- **If you encounter animals, leave the area and search elsewhere, or come back later.**
- Check Fish and Game's website for seasonal antler gathering closures.

ATTENTION NONRESIDENTS: Beginning July 1, 2024, a nonresident must have a valid Idaho hunting license (excluding Small Game and Nongame Hunting Licenses) before searching for, collecting, possessing, or transporting antlers or horns shed from deer, elk, moose, or pronghorn originating in Idaho. Nonresidents under the age of twelve who are accompanied by a licensed nonresident, or an Idaho resident are not required to possess a hunting license.

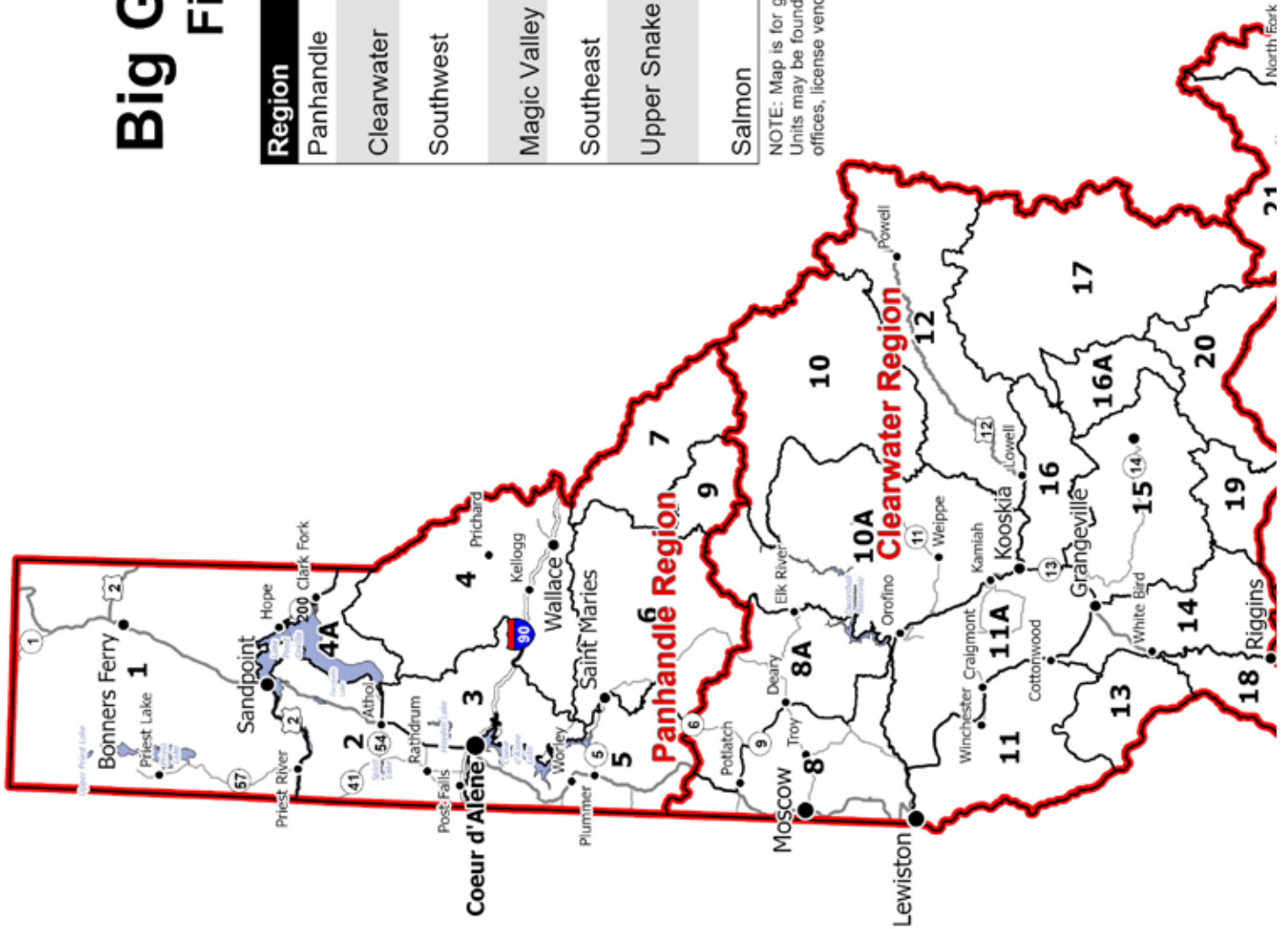


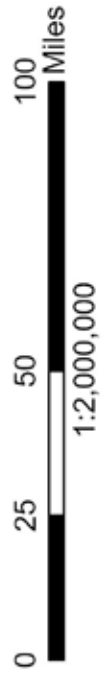
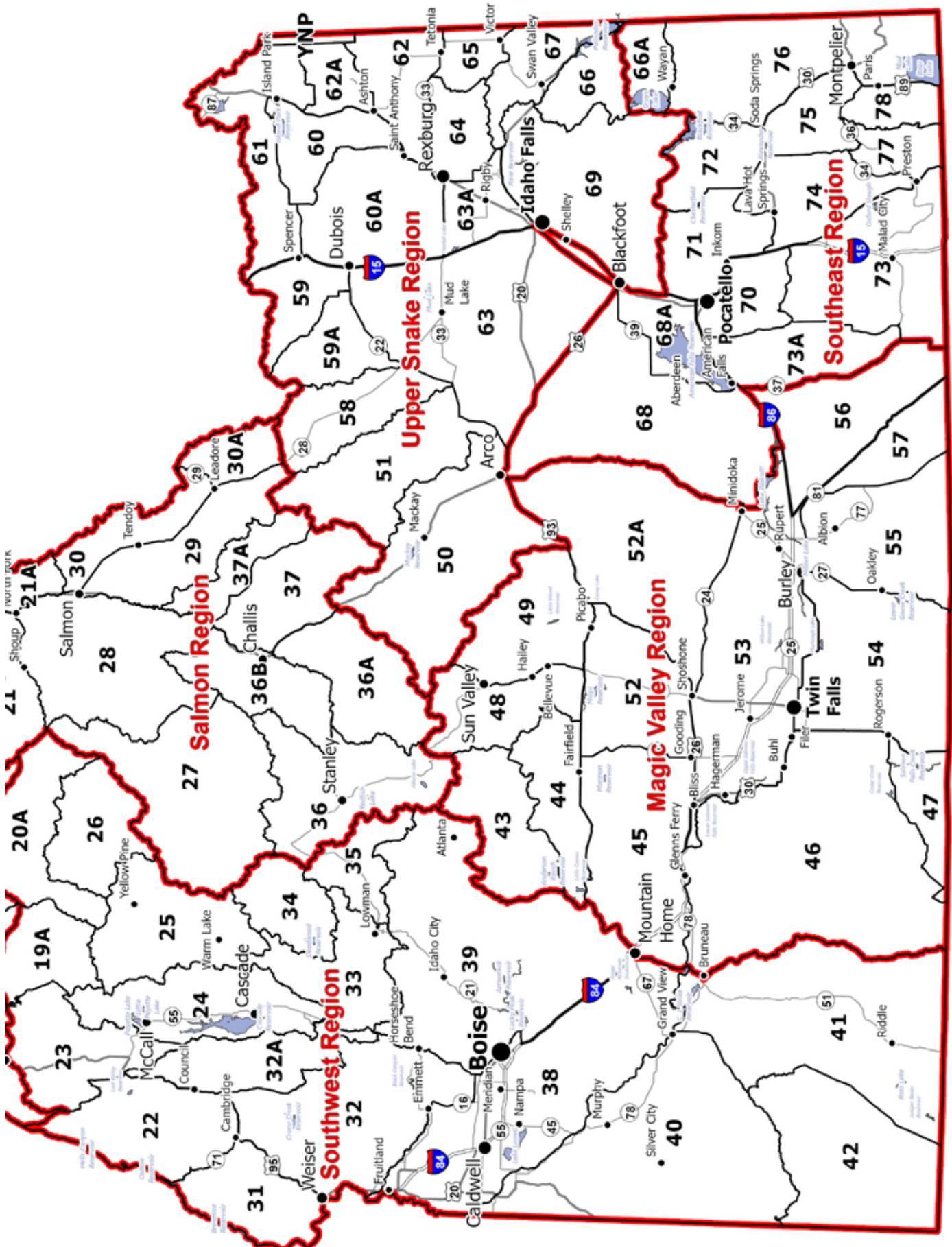
